

PE and Sport Grant 2013-2014



The government is providing additional funding from September 2013 to improve provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

We have decided to target the following areas to improve provision of PE at Shevington Vale.

- We have appointed a specialist PE teacher 'Mrs. Morgan' who teaches children PE on a weekly basis. This year Mrs. Morgan will work alongside teachers to strengthen specific aspects of the PE curriculum and provide support for weaker areas of PE.
- As well as delivering PE lessons during the school day Mrs. Morgan will also lead a weekly after school sports club. This will be targeted at different year groups and will include a range of sports.
- We are increasing pupils' participation in both intra and inter school competition this year. When possible Mrs. Morgan will incorporate her after school clubs to practise for these events.
- As well as working alongside Mrs Morgan some of our school staff will receive additional training in the teaching of PE.

In order to monitor the children's progress a structured formative and summative assessment programme is in place.

In addition, child and parental questionnaires will be carried out in order to assess current provision and further areas for development.

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IMPACT 2013-14

- ✓ There was the opportunity for the children to take part in 7 different sports clubs: Football- Netball- Dodge ball- Badminton Sports Hall Athletics- Rounders –Athletics.
- ✓ Shevington Vale took part in 7 competitions across the academic year – more children across school took part in competitive sports than ever before.
- ✓ There has been a small yet gradual increase in the number of children coming to school on scooters as a result of the purchase of cycle /scooter stands.
- ✓ Accurate and regular assessments have been made on the children to assess their level of attainment in PE across a range of sports which allowed staff to report more accurately on the standard of attainment in the end of year school report.

PE and Sport Grant 2014-2015



The same funding was given to school as last year and the same pattern was adopted with a specialist PE coach supporting all staff to deliver high quality PE. This does use the vast majority of the funding across the academic year. The coach does support all classes across school.

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Following half term in February the school commissioned a specialist PE coach from Wigan Sports Development to replace the specialist teacher as she stepped down from the position to continue the excellent work already started.

Coach Stephen will now work across school.

This will increase provision as there will now be 2 weekly clubs after school.

Tuesday 3.30pm-4.30pm	EYFS and Key Stage 1
Friday 3.30pm- 4.30pm	Key Stage 2

The children will be consulted as to the content of those clubs.

The remainder of the money will be spent on resources and transportation of children to competitions and the cost of covering classes should the competitions be during the day and staff need to be released.

IMPACT 2014-15

- ✓ 75% of children across school attended an after school club run by the coach- clubs were requested by the pupils.
- ✓ A sports club for Y5/Y6 pupils was extended due to self- esteem issues in the run up to the assessments in May resulting in the progress measures being above floor standards – the coach worked on the team skills and celebrating individual skills.
- ✓ Following a period of intensive training the specialist coach worked on football skills allowing the small Y6 cohort to take part in a local competition.- although they didn't win the way in which they dealt with defeat was much improved from previous years and scores were more favorable between our team and our opposition – our team actually recognized the improvement from previous years.
- ✓ We have low rates of obesity in our classes and an excellent record of uptake by our families in weight screening, showing that sport and healthy lifestyles are valued by all.
- ✓ Children know that being good at sport is valued through our weekly sport certificates.
- ✓ PE money has sported the purchase of a new scheme in discussion with our coach to ensure continuity and provision in teaching and learning when sessions are not led by him.
- ✓ Accurate assessment of the New National Curriculum –coach supported staff with benchmarking of working within and working below standards- the majority of our children are working within the expected age related expectations.

- ✓ Having a sports coach has allowed our children to access free, yet quality sports clubs after school with a person who knows their abilities and needs allowing teaching staff to focus on interventions of closing gaps in reading writing and maths.

This year:

- ✓ Specialist PE coach to support curriculum delivery across school.
- ✓ Specialist PE coach to advise and support staff with lesson planning, delivery and assessment.
- ✓ EYFS and KS1 Play Leader training for Y5 pupils to promote leadership skills.
- ✓ Lunchtime Welfare training of staff – modeling by coach.
- ✓ Coach supporting the entry and training of a new range of competition sports across school- 7 competitions.
- ✓ Coach developing skills of PE co-coordinator in new sports.
- ✓ Supporting the development of an NQT in school.
- ✓ Securing those assessments with staff.

IMPACT 2015-16

- ✓ Continued offer for free multi- sports after school club with approximately 80% uptake of children through the year.
- ✓ Through the clubs around 50% of attendees trying a new sport not experienced before Specialist PE coach to support curriculum delivery across school also enhancing equality of provision.
- ✓ Specialist PE coach to advise and support staff with lesson planning, delivery and assessment
- ✓ EYFS and KS1 Play Leader training for Y5 pupils to promote leadership skills which has impacted upon number of behaviour incidents at lunchtimes and facilitated family lunchtime days allowing families to see how their children play at less structured times of the day –this has resulted in less parent/carer concerns as children are enjoying their social time .
- ✓ Children accessing structured exercise at lunchtimes.
- ✓ Shevington Vale now being commented on their attendance at more sports competitions across the year by other schools' sports co-ordinators- hence school profile raised in the community.
- ✓ Sport has far more high profile than ever in school which was used as part of a marketing time.
- ✓ Shevington Vale achieved the Silver Sports Award in Wigan for their work in Sport and involvement in sporting competitions in 2015-16 .
- ✓ Sports skills are recognised as supporting our school values as certificates are awarded by the play leaders each week.
